On Friday, Gov. Tom Wolf announced that eight more counties would move to the green phase this Friday, June 19. These counties include Dauphin, Franklin, Huntingdon, Luzerne, Monroe, Perry, Pike, and Schuylkill. [Read full story](#).

Reminder: Contact your County Commissioners Today for COVID Funding

If your township has COVID-related expenses, PSATS is urging townships to contact your county commissioners immediately to request a share of the \$1.625 billion in federal CARES Act funding that counties will have in hand by July 15. Counties only have until tomorrow to apply for this funding.

Township expenses must be for response and planning efforts related to COVID-19 that are not reimbursable through the Federal Emergency Management Agency. Eligible expense could be teleconference or virtual meeting expenses, website and communication expenses, high-speed internet, equipment or software for telework, building alterations, and signage (such as installing clear plastic dividers at reception areas or between work areas, temperature screening equipment, and additional staffing). Townships must document that these expenses are a direct response or planning effort to COVID-19. Expenses must be incurred between March 1, 2020, and December 30, 2020.

Townships in ALL counties with eligible expenses should request funding from their county commissioners. Both federal direct-funded counties (7) and state DCED block grant counties (60) are permitted to allocate COVID dollars to municipalities.

Commonwealth Court Expedites Emergency Declaration Case; Wolf Asks Supreme Court to Intervene

The Pennsylvania Commonwealth Court has decided to expedite its review of the Senate lawsuit urging the court to require Gov. Tom Wolf to terminate the emergency declaration as stated in the concurrent resolution passed by the House and Senate last week.

Wolf has made a “King’s Bench” application and requested that the Pennsylvania Supreme Court intervene in the debate over the emergency declaration. Wolf argues that the legislature does not have the ability to unilaterally require him to end the emergency declaration without submitting for his signature or veto, which the legislature may override. He contends that the state’s highest court should end the controversy as soon as possible due to confusion to the public and its impact on the public health.
