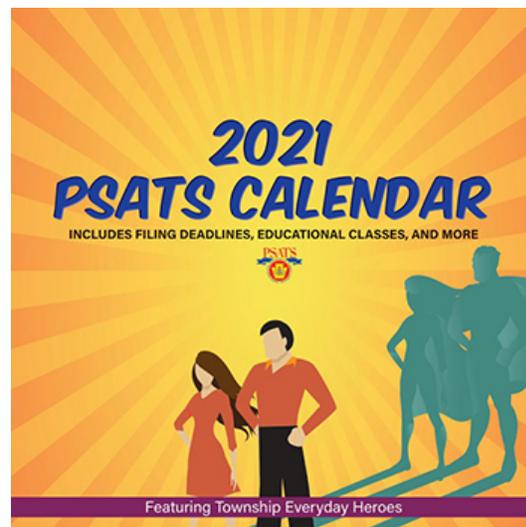

[State Fire Commissioner Accepting Applications for Act 13 Emergency Services Grant Program](#)

Starting today, the Office of the State Fire Commissioner is accepting applications for the 2020 Act 13 Unconventional Gas Well Fund Grant program until July 31, 2020. Fire companies, rescue companies, and emergency medical services throughout the 40 counties in which unconventional gas wells are located, or counties that directly border these counties, are eligible to apply for the grants. Governor Signs Short-Term State Budget

On May 29th, Governor Wolf signed the 2020 five-month budget package into law. The \$25.8 Billion 5 month budget does not include any tax increases and does fund the state's schools, institutions of higher learning and child care programs through the entire next

fiscal year, giving them universities and school districts stability as they chart their budgets. The state will also make its usual contributions to SERS and PSERS and will fund an entire year's worth of some crucial health and environmental programs.

\$625 million from the CARES Act will go to the 60 counties that did not receive direct aid from the federal government. The Department of Community and Economic Development is required to distribute this money to counties by July 15, 2020. These distributions are based on population and each eligible county will receive no less than \$1 million which must be prioritized for subgrantees not awarded money from CARES I and used for the following purposes:

- Offsetting cost of direct county response, planning, and outreach related to COVID-19, including PPE;
- Small business grant programs to support businesses with fewer than 100 employees, priority to those that did not get paycheck protection funds;
- Grants for economic development;
- Assistance to municipalities for response and planning efforts related to COVID-19, including PPE purchases;
- Behavioral health and substance use disorder treatment;
- Nonprofit assistance for 501c3 or c19;
- Broadband internet deployment with priority given to unserved or underserved areas.

Coronavirus Relief Fund Legislation for Fire and EMS Signed into Law

On May 29th Governor Wolf signed Act 26 of 2020 (*formerly SB 122*) into law. Act 26 allocates \$44 million from Federal stimulus dollars to provide grants to fire companies and \$6 million to EMS organizations.
