ARPA Municipal Payments Total Nearly \$478 Million

State Treasurer Stacy Garrity announced that the seventh batch of payments under the American Rescue Plan Act's (ARPA) Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery program has been sent to qualifying Pennsylvania municipalities.

Disbursements made this week include payments to 70 municipalities totaling \$5.62 million. Combined with previous payments, that means 2,274 Pennsylvania municipalities with populations of less than 50,000 have received more than \$477.8 million. Payment information can be found on this [interactive map](#) on Treasury's website.

Municipalities with populations of more than 50,000 were required to apply directly to the U.S. Department of the Treasury.

Pa. COVID-19 Cases, Hospitalizations Continue to Rise

8,912 new cases of COVID-19 were reported last week, a 21% increase compared to the prior week and an increase for the fifth week in a row. Despite this, the commonwealth has the fifth lowest growth in cases per 100,000, with Louisiana, Florida, and Mississippi making up the top three. While state and national cases continue to increase, the rates have slowed compared to a few weeks ago.

The [number of COVID-19 hospitalizations in Pennsylvania](#) increased for the fourth week in a row to 1,064, with 297 patients in the ICU. In the last four weeks, hospitalizations due to COVID-19 in Pennsylvania have nearly quadrupled and the number of patients in the ICU has more than tripled. Pennsylvania hospital capacity is not at risk. While the year-end daily death rate was over 200 per day, the current death rate is less than 20 per day.

Pennsylvania's statewide percent-positivity rate increased for the sixth week in a row from 5.4% to 6%. 18 counties now have rates less than 5%, 42 counties have rates of 5% to less than 10%, and seven counties have rates of 10% to less than 20%. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention is recommending that moderately to severely immunocompromised people who are fully vaccinated with Pfizer and Moderna receive an additional dose of vaccine. On August 16, Babe Ruth and Elvis Presley died.

In 1948, baseball legend George Herman "Babe" Ruth dies from cancer in New York City. For two days following, his body lay in state at the main entrance to Yankee Stadium, and tens of thousands of people stood in line to pay their last respects.

In 1977, Popular music icon Elvis Presley dies in Memphis, Tennessee. He was 42. The death of the "King of Rock and Roll" brought legions of mourning fans to Graceland, his mansion in Memphis. Doctors said he died of a heart attack, likely brought on by his addiction to prescription barbiturates.
